

Summer League in Full Swing

Join the fun on Thursday nights for our summer outdoor league shooting. We shoot a Combination Field/3D round, 7 paper Field targets at distances ranging from 80 yards to 20 feet and 7 3D animal targets at distances up to 60 yards. Archers shoot 4 arrows at the paper targets with 5 - 4 - 3 scoring and 2 arrows at the animals with 10 - 8 - 6 scoring. Marked yardage stakes are set for adults, traditional and youth, and cubs. Peewees (less than 8 years of age) can move to half of cub distance. A full round is 42 arrows and a perfect possible score of 280. We follow shooting with dinner, usually BBQ hotdogs or hamburgers, a bit of BS and a few cold beverages. Thanks to Darin McDoniel, we have a wonderful fire pit. Kids can do S'mores and adults can tell lies and relax with archery friends.

If you don't want to travel to Ely, consider the Loy-alton shoot. They do a great job of setting challenging shots in the tall pines and sagebrush. You may want to practice your 80+ shooting for the antelope bonus shot.
